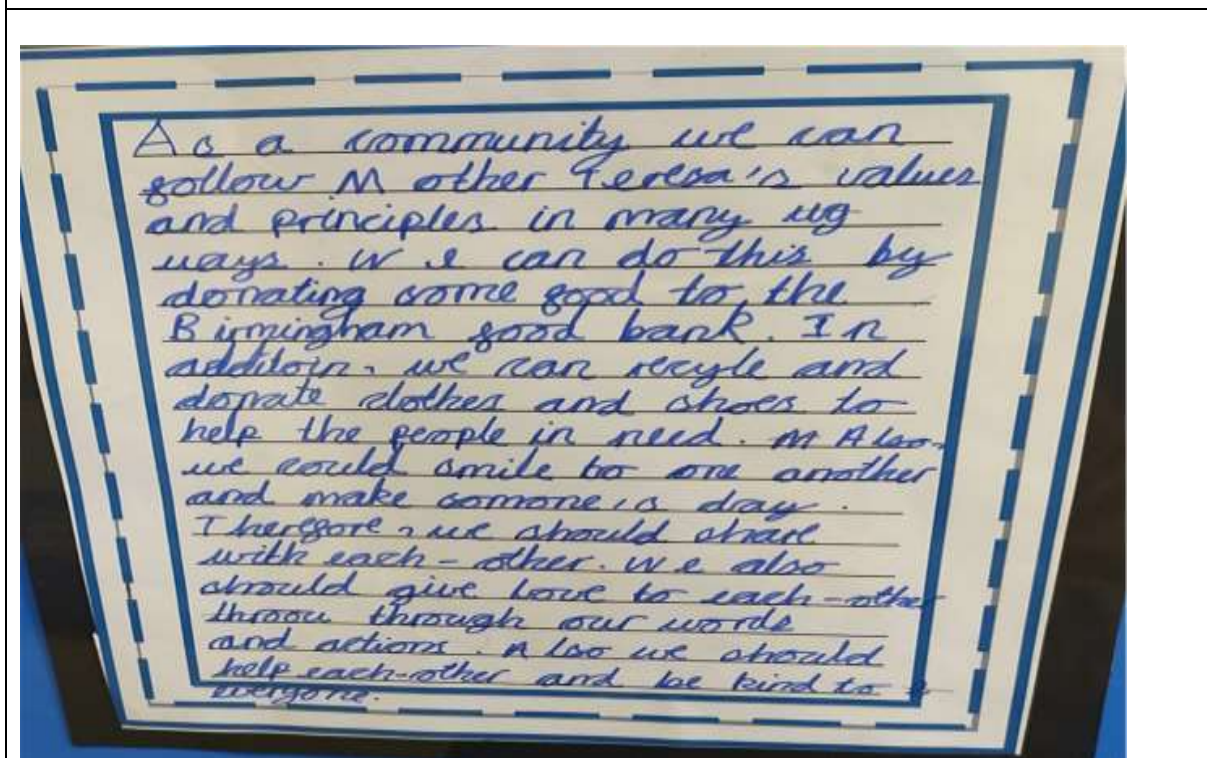


Exploring Courageous Advocates

Muhammad Ali's Timeline



1942 He was born on 17th January in Kentucky, America he was named Cassius Marcellus Clay.

1954 The police officer and his boxing coach told him to learn how to box just after his bike was stolen.

1960 He competed in the Roman Olympics and won a Gold medal. He decided to become a boxer.

1964 Cassius won the world Heavyweight championship and converted to Islam.

1967 He refused to join the U.S. Army and fight in the Vietnam war because of this, he was arrested.

1971 He appealed and in his conviction was overturned.

1974 He won the world Heavyweight championship for the second time.

1978 Muhammad won the world Heavyweight championship for the third time.

1979 Muhammad announced his retirement from boxing.

1980 Muhammad had become unwell and fought his last boxing match.

1984 He was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, which over time had affected his movement.

2012 Muhammad appeared at the opening ceremony of the London Olympics.

2016 Muhammad died in hospital age 74, in Phoenix Arizona.

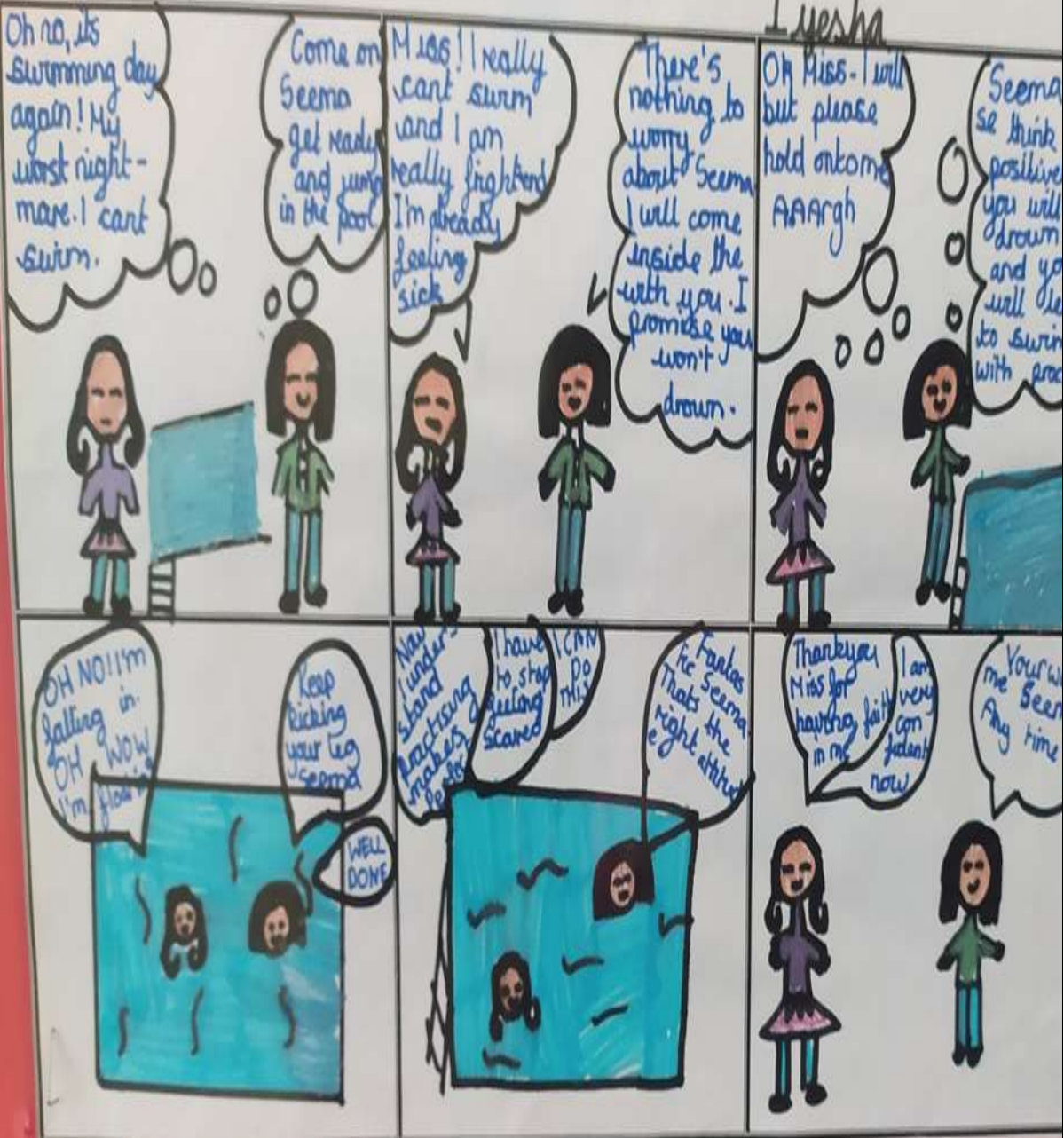
