Phonics

During our daily Phonics lesson we learn a new sound and practising reading and writing words using these sounds. So far we have learnt Ss, Aa, Tt, Pp, Ii, Nn, Mm, Dd and this week we added Gg, Oo, Cc and Kk to our phonic knowledge.

Maths

We have been learning about separating objects in different ways and counting objects that cannot be moved. Why not play a little game to practise this?

Play Bunny Ears

Using 2 hands to be the ears, how many ways can you show 1, 2 and 3? Can you see what number I have made? Can you make ears the same as mine? Can you make the number in a different way?

Literacy

This week we have been reading the traditional tale, 'The Little Red Hen' to support our learning about Harvest and seasons. We made bread with Miss Peplow - can you remember which ingredients we needed and how we made the bread? What did it look/smell/taste like?

Can you retell the story to someone in your family? Which part of the story do you like best?

Weekly Homework Challenge (also online on your BGFL 365 account)

This week we have set you a Maths Challenge. How many shapes can you see around your home, in the garden, on your walk home from school? Remember that 2D shapes are flat shapes that cannot be picked up so look carefully at the shapes you see around you. Have a go at drawing a picture of any shapes you find and write down what you saw using your sounds. Ask someone in your family to help you. Why not upload a picture of your work to your BGFL files so we can have a look at it too!
